

About a hundred public workstations are available to you in the Public Library network.

Some allow you to consult the Library's website, the catalogue and your reader folder. Others also allow you to consult the Internet.

The Library's Internet access workstations are tools for searching for information and documentation. The Library provides access to websites and other media as part of its mission to disseminate information and access culture.

The use of these Internet consultation stations is subject to compliance with a number of rules.

### Rules of consultation

- Access to positions requires identification. Borrower card holders use their usual identifiers; people who do not have a borrower card can request identifiers at the reception desk. They are issued free of charge for a period of one year, on presentation of an identity document.
- Internet access is limited to 2 hours per day.
- Web pages may be printed. This service comes with a charge and is reserved for strictly personal use.
- The posts do not give access to ftp sites, discussion forums, chat sites and so on.

### Safety rules

In order to prevent the spread of viruses, the following functions are not available:

- file transfer,
- unloading to the hard disk using a USB flash drive or an external drive.

### Ethics

- The use of the Internet is reserved, as a priority, for documentary research.
- The consultation of sites must comply with the laws in force (copyright, respect for the human person).
- It is not permitted to consult sites that are contrary to the missions of a public service library, in particular pornographic sites, those that promote violence, discrimination or illegal practices, or that incite racist hate crime.

Librarians may stop the consultation of sites that are contrary to these rules. In the event of non-compliance with these rules, the right to consultation is suspended.
